Suddenly, many countries joined us and we had thousands of participants. We continue to provide online follow-up through children and worship every Sunday.



Challenges of 2020

The most difficult thing was working with our national team online. Not all of them have good internet access; many of them do not have a computer at home. Some segments of our VBS program were recorded using low-quality cell phones and Jaime had to do major editing and production work using our old computer to be able to broadcast through Facebook. It was stressful; however, the result was a great blessing for all.

Hopes for 2021

It is difficult to make plans when nothing is certain, except to follow Christ in mission. We look forward to adapting and trusting that He will guide the team to fill the needs that arise every day. Our heart's biggest goal for 2021 is being able to exceed what has been achieved during this previous year and all its complications.

Additional Needs

The public education system in Mexico stopped in February 2020 like many countries in Latin America. Thousands of children do not have access to school due to the lack of internet connection. Part of our ministry is to provide basic education to children. We need to acquire high-speed internet to be able to share the signal with our students so they can access their educational platforms. Each student costs us \$150 per year to provide tuition and now also internet in their homes. Currently, only 11 out of 25 are covered, we are short by 14 students.
