



## Update from Adrian and Bernardeth Bobb-Kelly May 2021

Dear Friends,

First of all, thank you so much for keeping up the ministry with words of encouragement, prayers, and financial support.

Your support permits us to feed over 200 children five days a week, buy medicines and have medical brigades every two months, train pastors and midwives twice a year, give care and support to the children at the two foster homes, and of course, provide a salary to the staff.

We continue to feed the children and, because of the unemployment situation due to the pandemic, more and more children are coming seeking food. Despite the difficult situation, a lady from Tabitha's board blessed us with a whole pig for the kitchen and the children enjoyed pork meat for two meals. We have also received a small donation of food from our local church and it was given to the homes.



The two Tabitha's homes are functioning well, but a very sad thing happened to us last month. The lady that used to take care of the boys' home died while she was on vacation. You might know who I am talking about—her name was Daisy and she used to sleep at the boys' home. Her death impacted all of us but especially the boys at the home. We were not informed of how serious her sickness was. She left behind a 10-year-old son by the name of Shondell. Please pray for him that as he deals with the going home of his mom. Pray that God may guide, strengthen, and keep him safe.

Two are in high school and one is in technical school studying to become an assistant in an operation room. Thank God she is doing very well.

This weekend we are planning a medical brigade up the river. During this trip, we will also work on a budget for the roof of our home base house that was destroyed by hurricane ETA and YOTA. This is where we do a clinic in the village of Makantakita. Please continue to help us so we can be a blessing to the poor and the needy in the communities along the Rio Grande River.
