The Story of Baby Bokamoso

I want to share a beautiful story with you from our friends at Setshabelo Family and Child Services.



Baby Bokamoso is shown here (left) in the caring arms of one of Setshabelo’s loving social workers. But life didn’t start out that way; in fact, it almost didn’t start out at all.

Bokamoso was conceived from a relationship characterized by violence. The birth mother said that giving her up for adoption was the only way to cut ties with her abuser (the birth father). When she was three months pregnant, she alleged the birth father assaulted her so bad, that as a result, they both thought the baby died. But God stretched His hand over them both. Now she wanted Setshabelo to find a loving home for her baby.

Bokamoso was safe, but she had not found a home yet. A few months later . . .

“I just witnessed a teary union,” Setshabelo adoption specialist Boniswa said. “Bokamoso has found a family!”

Mr. and Mrs. Mothekhe are a childless couple who applied to adopt Bokamoso. The adoptive father got so emotional as the child was handed over to them. They have already given her a name Owaratwa, meaning “she is loved.”



They promise to give Bokamoso a warm and loving family.

Glory be to God! Owaratwa is thriving with her loving, forever family.
