Dear Friends,

Lumela! Thank you dear ones for all the ways you have supported my work and ministry for the benefit of orphaned and vulnerable children in Botshabelo, South Africa. As we joyfully close the month when we celebrate adoptions, I offer Peter's story. This is just one of many stories of children adopted by their family members through Setshabelo's Kinship Foster Care and Adoption work.

Peter Thami Tsomile had a stroke at age 4, which left him with a physical disability. His biological mother, unable to provide for his special needs and pregnant with another child, abandoned him at an informal settlement. Peter's biological father died in a car accident in 2015. Peter was then adopted by his paternal grandmother.



Ms. Mmabatho Sarah Thamae, Peter's paternal grandmother, works as a domestic worker and earns a salary of R3000 [176.50 USD] a month. She has been taking care of Peter since he was abandoned by his birth mother. Wanting to provide a permanent loving home for her grandson, she applied to adopt Peter. She contacted a social worker from SFCS who conducted a home study, prepared all relevant assessments, and presented the adoption case to the court, which was subsequently approved.

Peter is now 13 years old and his left limbs are not fully functional. His speech and body movement are affected by the stroke as well as his cognitive functioning, making it difficult for him to cope in a mainstream school.



Peter's road ahead is a difficult one but he will always have his grandmother by his side giving him the love and warmth necessary to heal his trauma. Instead of dreaming of a forever family like others who have been orphaned in Botshabelo, he dreams of someday becoming a lawyer and a DJ.

Strong kinship ties can be crucial to the development and good health of children. The social workers at Setshabelo Family and Child Services work hard to locate, train, and license safe and loving family members so orphaned children can have continuity as well as permanency within their own families when possible.

Purse

Did you know that some families are unable to adopt because the subsidy they receive for foster care is more than the one provided after adoption? It's true. The foster families receive R980 per month [58 USD] while adopted families receive R420 per month [25 USD].

7,200 USD would provide a grant for one child to move from foster care to adoption and be provided for from birth to 18 years old.
