cross-cultural workers debrief and process their field experiences. We gained some great tools and enjoyed getting to know several other couples and individuals who find themselves in similar places. To the right, we are hiking at a beautiful park near the retreat center.

The Lord continues to provide for us in amazing ways. On October 1, we moved into a fully furnished home that we are renting from a family whose business took them to India! It is a wonderful space with lots of room for guests...yes, that's an invitation! We have been blessed to be able to host our small group from church and several other gatherings. Abby and Ben

Abby has enjoyed being part of the Fellowship of Christian Athletes (which, at the high school level, includes non-athletes like her) and show choir. Ben loved Lego League and is looking forward to new adventures next semester. They are both involved in youth ministries at church, as well.
