Dear Friends,

Merry Christmas from Oman!

I have been asked recently by my Omani friends about my views of peace as a Christian. Like the rest of the world, they are deeply troubled by the violence in Israel and Gaza. My

response: I shared with one of my friends a sermon that I preached recently at the Protestant Church in Oman while providing pulpit supply as they wait for their new pastor to arrive.

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In the sermon, I noted that Arabic and Hebrew are from the same language family and that the word for peace is similar, Shalom (Hebrew) and Salam (Arabic). If we look at the words in their native script, they both contain the same root letters S-L-M. Both Arabic and Hebrew speakers use it as a greeting. For both, it is a central concept of their life and faith.

Shalom/Salam, or peace, is not just the absence of conflict or violence. It is the active process of being well, healthy, prosperous, and sustained. When greeted with Shalom or Salam Aleikum, it is a prayer for the one you are greeting.

Jesus, in the Sermon on the Mount, says "Blessed are the Peacemakers" or blessed are the makers of Shalom. Blessed are those who bring wellness and wholeness to the community. He didn't say blessed are the peaceful, or ones

in a state of peace. Instead, he said blessed are the ones active in bringing Shalom into their community and the world, for they will be known as children of God.

It is not enough to not be in conflict with each other, we must be active in bringing peace, working for peace, and for something that will last beyond a moment, a day, or a year.
