So, for those who previously received my Dear Friends letters and stopped receiving them, welcome back.

For those who signed up to receive these letters and have not received them until now, welcome. I apologize for the error.

I'm grateful for each and every one of you.

Two Appeals

I would like to end this letter with two appeals for prayer.

RCA Global Mission is committed to raising \$85,000 to support the work of RCA missionaries Shelvis and Nancy Smith-Mather and RECONCILE, Int. (an RCA Global Mission partner) to provide peacebuilding, social cohesion, and trauma care for South Sudanese refugees living in Uganda. We announced the South Sudan Refugee Care Project for World Refugee Day in June 2022, and set a lofty goal of raising these funds by June 2023. We did not meet that goal. But, we have not forgotten about the people of South Sudan and their hopes for peace and healing, and we've extended this fundraising project until June 2024. So far we've raised \$65,000 of the \$85,000 goal. Yet it seems as though every time there is a new violent conflict or natural disaster that occurs in the world, we lose momentum in meeting the needs of the people of South Sudan.



RECONCILE Peace Building Training

Will you join RCA Global Mission in prayer for peace in South Sudan? Will you pray that we meet our goal of raising \$85,000 for the South Sudan Refugee Care Project by June 2024? Will you pray that, through the work of the Smith-Mather Family and RECONCILE, Intl. the people of South Sudan experience the love the Christ in tangible, life-giving ways?

More recently, as we've all witnessed the conflict in Israel/Palestine with horror (and perhaps a large dose of helplessness and hopelessness), God revealed an opportunity for RCA Global Mission to care for people

displaced in Lebanon by this escalating conflict. Rev. Linda Macktaby (a former student of Peter Ford and the Near East School of Theology) has assembled a network of interfaith colleagues who are providing shelter, mattresses, food, clean water, medicine, and fuel for cooking/heating, but they cannot meet these needs by themselves. More than 100,000 people in Lebanon have been displaced and need care, and Pastor Linda is also providing provisions and spiritual care for more than 300 Lebanese Christians who remain in their villages along

the Israel/Lebanon border. RCA Global Mission has sent \$10,000 of emergency funds through the Refugee Crisis Fund to Pastor Linda to provide lifesaving care, and in December we invited people to give financial support to the Lebanon Displacement Relief Project.

Will you join RCA Global Mission and pray for peace in the Holy Land? Will you pray for Pastor Linda, her colleagues, and the thousands of people affected by the escalating conflict in Lebanon? Will you pray for generous giving to support Pastor Linda's work through the Lebanon Displacement Relief Project?

The scripture verse I chose to center in my work for 2023 was this:

The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness does not overcome it. (John 1:5)
