Our situation is no different from yours, I suspect. How can the end of the year be upon us already? If we think back, we were in the U.S. for the first three months of the year—which was busy with appointments and anticipation for what felt like a premature return to Mozambique. This feels like a lifetime ago. But, as you do, we settled back in and picked up the pieces that we had stepped away from for five months. This primarily included diving back into homeschooling, reconnecting with palliative care patients, meeting new ones, and starting a new vision at the farm.



Fast forward to December and here we are, the girls have completed another school year. The compassionate care team is working towards having cared for 200 patients as a project in total and agroforestry seems to be the best hope for our area where the rains have yet to fall and we anticipate a very difficult growing season which, unfortunately, equals hunger to many.

Last week when Dara was visiting an elderly woman, we mentioned that Christmas is coming. Her response was, "We're usually eating a lot of corn by Christmas. How can it be Christmas already? There is no corn." Yes, the world continues to change and one of the greatest challenges we face is to adapt to and be creative in addressing the needs that are so abundant to all we work with. This is where the new agroforestry emphasis at the farm aims to serve. We hope to point our neighbors to the Creator and build resilience and food security by using diverse mixtures of perennial and annual crops.
