God Is Working

It seems as though the modern-day teenager is lost—looking for something more than they can see, feel, and hear. They are taught

that nothing is more important than their identity, feelings, and school. Youth today are more educated, publicly supported, informed, and entertained-yet more conflicted and depressed than ever before. Working with a middle school or high school student can be challenging and sometimes heartbreaking. As a pastor and Youth Director at The Way Out Ministries for 15+ years, I have the opportunity to meet with many of these kids every week. God is at work in them and He gives constant reminders of that hope.

I have learned that faithfulness, consistency, and relationships produce life-long disciples of faith. It brings me such joy to see many of our youth now leading small groups, serving at outreaches, and living for Jesus day by day. David, who was once in my youth group, has even become one of our team members here at The Way Out.

There were many times, when working with these same kids in the past, that I felt exhausted and defeated, but by the grace of God, I pressed on to invest in them, and the harvest was well worth the labor! I want to share a random note that I received from one such teen who is now a young adult:

Hey Ryan. Just got to thinking and I'm so thankful for y'all. I

don't think I'd get this close to God if it wasn't for the ministry. I've been to other churches before, but this one is the only one that really got me closer and brought out my belief and trust in God. I'm closer than I've ever been. Again thank you and all the people at The Way Out.

> Small moments like this are God's sweet reminders that He is always at work, even when we don't realize it. I was also blessed recently when one of my new teens, who had transitioned from our Children's programs, came to me and said "I want to start a Bible club at my school. I don't know what to do, can you *help?"* Her mom later told me, *"She takes notes every Monday* night so she can be ready to teach a Bible club she's starting." Reylenn is a sweet girl who is naturally timid and shy, but she stepped out in faith to bring Christ to her peers. I am so proud of her willingness to be bold! Revlenn is now leading that weekly Bible club on her school campus. I was able to teach this past week, and it was such a blessing to see her excitement to build healthy relationships and share the truth with her classmates.
