Dear Friends,

Happy New Year 2024! We pray that this letter finds you in good health and well-rested after celebrating our Savior's birth and the holiday season. Marie and Laurey came home from their respective universities in St. Paul, MN, and Ames, IA, in mid-December and our family celebrated Christmas together and with the larger Johnson clan. The two older girls are on break until mid-January.

We're thankful for your faithfulness and support for the mission and ministry in 2023. I feel that the year was about sowing seeds as I have spent most of my time these past 12 months preparing the curriculum in French for the Coram Deo pastor training program. We have six students in



the online/distance education program, although not all of them have been diligent in their studies. However, this has been enough to get a sense of our approach and to adapt the material to our students' realities.

My best student has been Teddy who was recently posted to Lubumbashi, Congo, for his employment, although he is from Kinshasa. He is a middle-aged businessman with a growing family who has many contacts in the U.S. and a history of church involvement and leadership. He had never formally studied the Bible or theology but was often taking on pastoral roles in ministry. A recent illness required him to go on medical leave while he obtained treatment. As he has felt better during recovery, he has been studying our course material and meeting with me weekly through Zoom for videoconferencing. Even though we don't require such frequent meetings, Teddy has preferred to share his responses in conversations with me over just sending in written answers. This allows for many fruitful exchanges and my Congolese students seem to prefer this form of interaction—it's much more like a master-apprentice format than a professor-student one.

Generally speaking, we enter 2024 in good health. Aichatou is continuing to improve on her medications and works two part-time jobs. Marie was accepted into UNW-St. Paul's School of Education after taking all the prerequisites, so she now begins the education coursework part of her Music Education program. Laurey added
