table. The rise of inflation, however, continues to be a stressor for our students. The higher costs of living mean that students must dedicate more time to work and count their *céntimos*. One of the students we have seen thrive in CdM is Eva. At the beginning of each calendar year, we accept new students. They come from their rural communities with undefined dreams to change their futures. The physical appearance mirrors the heart-hunched shoulders, shrouded eyes, and a general disheveled look. February 2023, Eva exemplified this. For her, it came from an abandonment of her parents and financial struggles. She had a hopelessness that this poverty could not be overcome. Throughout the 11 months, we have seen Eva lean into the Word, apply the teachings of Proverbs by Albino, hear the gospel from Yoni the director, read the truth in her required daily Bible devotions, and rely on the community of believers. Her heart has changed this year. She knows to whom she belongs and was baptized in June. Her physical circumstances have not changed; if anything it's more difficult. Her clothes may still speak of poverty, but her countenance is one of confidence and joy, the head held high and a smile on her face. Her life and eternal future are forever changed; we continue to pray for the rest of the family that they, too, will see the difference Jesus has made for Eva and will choose to follow Him.
